MARIAN URSAN:

Even if there are many positive aspects related with science, which gives us more answers to our medical problems, I think we are a bit worse than 20, 30 years ago. In 2019, in a European Union country, people are dying in the bushes. In downtown Bucharest, in the neighborhoods, in the wintertime, after the snow goes away, we see dead bodies. We all are responsible. We cannot enjoy our lives being aware that people around us are dying in the bushes.

There are many things to be done. One of the things is to invest in a new political generation, and educate them to pay attention to the vulnerable people and also get their ideas and put it on the political agenda.
